## 4. Cases Booked:

- a) Flying Squads, SSTs and Police authorities have booked **1,544** FIRs with regard to seizures of cash, liquor, drugs, precious metal and Freebies.
- b) Excise Department has booked **1,938** Heinous Cases, **2,400** cases for Breach of Licence Conditions, **118** NDPS and **11,790** cases under Section 15 (a) of Karnataka Excise act 1965 and also **1,172** different types of Vehicles have been seized.

## 5. Special Reports:

- a) Excise department has seized liquor of **9,367** bulk litres of IML worth **Rs. 1,09,61,895** in Neerumarga, Mangalore Taluk, Dakshina Kannada Parliamentary Constituency.
- b) Excise department has seized liquor of **8,687.800** litres of IML worth **Rs. 31,55,321** at KSBCL Depot, Neerumarga, Mangalore Taluk, Dakshina Kannada District.
- c) Excise department has seized liquor of **8,658** ltrs of IML worth **Rs.19,29,726** at KSBCL Depot, Puttur, Dakshina Kannada District, Mangalore.

#### 6. Public Grievance Redressal:

Out of the **16,480** calls received through Voter Helpline, **16,315** people have sought information, **19** have given feedback, **18** have made suggestions and **128** have registered complaints. Cumulatively **16,480** calls have been disposed off. In addition **10,178** complaints have been registered by the citizens on NGRS portal, out of which, **9,959** complaints have been disposed off.

#### 7. cVIGIL:

**21,017** Complaints have been received through cVIGIL application. Major complaints received are related to Posters/Banners without permission **12,750**, Posters without mandatory declaration **973**, property defacement **297**, Money Distribution **167**, Distribution of gifts/coupons **97**, Campaigning during ban period **43**, Distribution of Liquor **118**, Vehicle or convoy without permission **61**, Religious or communal speeches/messages **37**, Display of Firearms, Intimidation **21** out of which **19,839** Complaints are found to be correct and action has been taken.

### 8. Media:

The complaints have been received through emails **164**, and letters **511**, Newspapers **24**, TV Channels **30** and Social Media **47** Out of the total **776** Complaints, **77** have been disposed off.

#### 9. ENCORE:

Under ENCORE, **3,680** Applications for permissions have been received; out of which **2,758** have been accepted and **537** have been rejected. **24** are in progress, **225** are pending and **136** are cancelled.

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
